# RULES

- 1 Exhibits may be staged on the evening prior to the show from 6.30pm-8.30pm  
Exhibits must be staged by 9.30am sharp on the day of the show
- 2 Judging will commence at 9.45am sharp
- 3 Exhibits must not be removed from the tent until 5pm
- 4 Exhibitors are reminded that exhibits will not be accepted after Tues 17<sup>th</sup> July
- 5 The committee reserves the right to cancel any class and to exclude any exhibit not considered fit for exhibition. The judges decision will be final.
- 6 The committee will not be responsible for any physical accident, no matter how caused.
- 7 Exhibitors will not be permitted in the tent during judging . Everyone other than officials and assistants must leave the tent at 9.30am.
- 8 No exhibits may be handled by the public.
- 9 The committee will take every possible care of the exhibits but cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage.
- 10 Exhibitors are asked to collect their entries immediately after the closing time of the show.
- 12 Prize money will be available for collection from the secretary after prize giving.
- 13 Prizes not collected on the day will be put into show funds.
- 14 Cups and trophies will be presented at 4.30pm.
- 15 Cups and trophies should be returned to secretary one month before next show.

## Protests

All protests must be delivered to the secretary of the show not later than 3pm on the day of the show. A deposit of £1 will be required with each protest, which sum will be forfeited if, in the opinion of the committee, such protest is considered to have been without foundation. The decision of the judges in all cases shall be final, subject to the right of the committee of the show to deal with all protests.
